

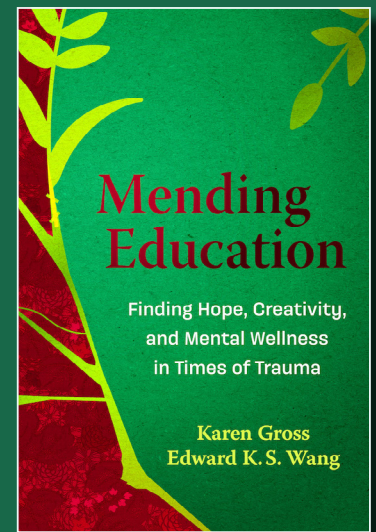
# PANDEMIC POSITIVES IN EDUCATION: WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED
